EMT delivers 115 ALADIN UAV Systems

The German Armed Forces have ordered a total of 115 ALADIN Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) Systems from EMT to equip its army task forces with small, high performance reconnaissance drones. The delivery starts in August 2005.

ALADIN is a mobile and compact Mini-UAV system comprising one portable control station and two aircraft with very low signatures that can be carried and brought into action in less than 5 minutes by only two men. It is designated for reconnaissance, identification and location in real-time up to a range of 5 km. The optional IR version for night reconnaissance is available by the end of this year.

ALADIN incorporates today the experience of more than 400 German Army reconnaissance missions that were conducted with preproduction systems in Afghanistan and in Germany under severe weather conditions and in difficult terrain.

ALADIN is the cost efficient solution for inconspicuous and flexible close range air reconnaissance.
